The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is an international standard for describing language ability. It describes language ability on a six-point scale, from A1 for beginners, up to C2 for those who have mastered a language.

Terms & Conditions

Booking and payment

Course fees must be received in full in advance of the commencement of the courses and are proof of booking and also acceptance of our T&Cs.

Equipment

Virtual classes will take place via cloud-based video conferencing with a PC, mobile phone or tablet. Students must have IT equipment of a high enough standard and an internet connection which is fast enough to hold the class.

Students must use a good pair of headphones and need to be in a quiet room with no background noise.

Teachers will not delay the start of the class or be held responsible for students who have technical issues.

Class reschedule policy

Group courses

Classes can exceptionally be rescheduled (if both the teacher and all the students agree) by contacting the teacher directly with a minimum of 24-hour notice between 9am and 5pm Monday to Friday.

For a Monday morning class notification will need to be received by the teacher by 5pm on Thursday the week before.

If less than 24-hour notice is given the class will be charged as taken.

One-to-one courses

For best learning outcome it's advisable to keep to the arranged regular class schedule.

Classes can be rescheduled by contacting the teacher directly with a minimum of 24-hour notice between 9am and 5pm Monday to Friday.

For a Monday morning class notification will need to be received by the teacher by 5pm on Thursday the week before.

If less than 24-hour notice is given the class will be charged as taken.

Refunds and cancellations

Course fees are non-refundable but the course start date can be postponed for a maximum of 6 months.

In the unlikely event that your teacher is unable to teach a class due to illness, bereavement or acts of God, your teacher will be substituted or the class postponed to another time mutually agreed by the client and the teacher.

Missed classes due to illness, holiday or any other reason will not be refunded.

These courses are not pay-as-you-go classes.

Bank holidays
